Bankers Association again wins international awards

As it did in 2016, the Liechtenstein Bankers Association (LBA) has again received the Wealth & Money Management Award. The interest association of the Liechtenstein banks has also once again been presented with the ACQ Global Award.

The ACQ Global Awards have been presented by the readers of ACQ magazine and the ACQ5 news portal since 2006. Both media outlets target CEOs and CFOs worldwide as well as other corporate financial and private equity leaders. According to the explanation of the award, "Every year, we seek their assistance in recognising industry leaders, eminent individuals, exemplary teams and distinguished businesses, which we believe represent the benchmark of achievement and best practice in a variety of fields." The ACQ Global Award as International Financial Services Body of the Year, which the Liechtenstein Bankers Association has once again received, is considered confirmation of the outstanding work performed by the Bankers Association. The awards set out to recognise the achievements of those who are responding most successfully to the demands placed on them by the market. "Our awards are the only industry honours given purely on the basis of voter participation." More than 200,000 proposals were submitted to the jury: "Guided by the poll results those businesses and individuals that have had the greatest impact on the industry during 2016 will be duly honoured. In judging these awards we will study the nominations made by our voters and recognise the leaders in their fields with exceptional performance and recognition."

As was the case in 2016, the Liechtenstein Bankers Association this year again received the Wealth & Money Management Award as the Best Private Banking & Wealth Management Organisation, presented for the fourth time by the British magazine Wealth & Finance International. The awards "are dedicated to rewarding and recognising the hard work and dedication of everyone working in this vast industry, including asset managers, financial planners, HNWI services and specialist banking providers." Business size and location are not relevant: Only those firms, departments or individuals are sought who support and guide their clients effectively through the complex process of managing their money, and who often serve as more than merely advisors. "As with all of our awards we have a rigorous selection and judging process which ensures that all winners can be assured that they truly deserve their award."

"And the awards are ultimately a confirmation that our platform services, our many implementation aids, but also our templates, sample letters, and our Villa Wirbelwind, cover areas that go beyond the usual work of comparable industry associations, thus creating additional value for our members."
